Tipu took the French soldiers in his army and declared a war with the British. At that time Lord Wellesley was the Governor – General in India. Tipu was asked to accept the subsidiary system and on his refusal the war was declared. Three armies from three sides, Bombay, Madras and Hydrabad attacked Tipu and thus Tipu died in his capital Seringapattam. The English took over a large part of Mysore. After the death of the fourth Peshwa, Narayan Rao was declared the next Peshwa. He was killed by his uncle Raghoba who was supported by the British and thus a war was declared. All the Maratha leaders got united with the Peshwa and the British forces were defeated.

Warren Hastings was then the Governor – General of India, who seized Gwalior and acknowledge Madhav Rao as the Peshwa. The Maratha chiefs Scindia and Bhosle refused to accept the subsidiary system, which was forced by the Governor – General Lord Wellesley. Hence a war was declared. The Maratha chiefs were defeated and were forced to accept the subsidiary system. Ahmednagar, and Broach were taken by the British and thus the Maratha chiefs lost their prestige. The British asked Holkar to accept the subsidiary system, who refused and thus a war was declared. The power of Holkar could not be broken by the British and the company made peace with him. After the death of Holkar the power of Maratha came to end and thus the British ultimately took the power.

Clive was called the founder of the British rule in India. He captured Carnatic. He attacked Calcutta, which was the seat of the East India Company. It was Clive who saved the British prestige in Bengal by fighting with Nawab of Bengal in the Battle of Plassey. He attacked and defeated the Dutch and thus put an end to the Dutch power in Bengal. In the Third Carnatic War he put the end to the French influence in Hydrabad. He was not only a brave soldier but also a great statesman by signing the treaty of Allahbad with the Mughal Emperor, Shah Alam and Shuja – ud – Daula.

Any Indian ruler who entered the subsidiary system with the British had to give some money or the territory to the British for the maintenance of the British army in that area. He would also promise not to enter into the alliance with any other power. He would not employ Non-English Europeans. He would allow a British resident to stay in the state. In the case of the conflict with any other state, he would agree to the decision of the British. He would acknowledge the English Company as the paramount power. On the above agreements the British would protect such a Prince from any external danger.

The English were able to maintain a vast army at the cost of the Indian Princes. The Money and the territory given to the British added to their resources. As a result of it, the English came to control the foreign policy of the Indian states. With this system, the British were able to eliminate the other foreign powers, such as French, from India. The Indian princes, who entered in such an alliance with the British, lost their sovereignty and prestige. The Indian princes had to pay a huge amount to the British and after some time nothing was left with them. As a result of this system lot of the Indian princes lost their territories to the British.
