# 1. Dialogue Completion.

(*Note:* When we want to add a question tag to a complex sentence (a sentence having a main clause and a subordinate clause) the tag should normally be created in accordance with the main clause. But when the subject of the main clause is the pronoun 'I' with verbs like 'think', 'hope', 'mean', 'suppose' etc, the tag is created as per the subordinate clause. Though the rules are so, exceptions can be taken especially when the proximity rule (the condition in which the distance between the main clause and the tag is too far and the sentence becomes clumsy) or the prominence of subject matter of the subordinate clause is to be considered. Then, the tag can be created according to the subordinate clause. Here, in this question, as per the rule, the tag should have been, 'don't you? But prominence has been given to the idea conveyed through the subordinate clause and the tag has been created as per the subordinate clause)

It has no past meaning even though 'had' is there in the structure. So, **had better** in this question is wrongly placed in the sense of 'you should have done something'.)
