The Provisional Government was unable to end the shortages of food Continuation of the world war led to growing unrest among people Weakness of the Provisional Government Economic and social problems Why did European countries unite against Napoleon? Napoleon spread the ideals of the Revolution and enlightenment throughout the lands he conquered, ending feudalism, promoting education etc European countries feared that it would spread throughout Europe. What problems led to the outbreak of a revolution in France? Economic hardships of the agrarian and lower class The ineffective ruling of Louis XIV, Political conflict between the monarchy and nobility over reforms of the economic system What were the three estates in French society? France divided society into three estates: the First Estate (clergy); the Second Estate (nobility); and the Third Estate (commoners). Who was the largest class in French society? The Third Estate was the largest but had few rights at all. Why was the Third Estate unhappy? They were treated poorly and overlooked by the two other estates. They paid all the taxes to the government. They were not entitled to any privileges enjoyed by the clergy and nobles

France was facing a severe financial crisis

Thomas Paine supported an independent and self-governing America, Paine denounced the monarchy and argued that people are born in to a state of equality.

Their ideas stimulated the American people to fight against Britain.

Progress in science brought about by Renaissance

Three central concepts of enlightenment were the use of reason, the scientific method, and progress.

Enlightenment thinkers believed they could help create better societies and better people.

The Enlightenment advocated such ideals as liberty, progress, tolerance, fraternity

It protested against the prevailing social system

How did the European colonization affect Latin America? explain?

When Europeans came to Latin America they brought many crops and ideas, but they also brought many deadly diseases to the previously isolated communities. That natives of Latin America had no immunity to these diseases, so the spread quickly and killed many.

Economically, widespread inflation and food shortages in Russia contributed to the revolution. Militarily, inadequate supplies, logistics, and weaponry led to heavy losses that the Russians suffered during World War I; this further weakened Russia

The social and economic order in France in late 18th century were extremely unequal and exploitative. The clergy and the nobility formed the first two Estates and were the most privileged classes in the French society. But third estate had no role in the administration and enjoyed low social status

Explain the contributions of thinkers to the French Revolution.?

France in the 18th century had many revolutionary thinkers. Among them were Voltaire, Rousseau, Montesquieu and Diderot. Their revolutionary ideas encouraged people to fight for their rights. They exposed the inefficiency of the monarch and his government and aroused the people to challenge authority.
