

WILLIAM WORDSWORTH

The famous English Romantic poet William Wordsworth was born on 7th April,1770 at Cockermouth in United Kingdom. He was known as a spiritual poet of nature. Wordsworth went to Cambridge University where he began to write his poems. Some of his known poems are Lines Composed a Few Miles Above Tintern Abbey, Lyrical Ballads, Intimations of Immortality, The Prelude etc. In 1843, Wordsworth was appointed poet laureate (official poet of a country). He passed away on April 23, 1850,in Westmorland.
