'The Best Investment I Ever Made' by A.J Cronin is an anecdote which tells us how the author's act of kindness transformed a man's life. An act of kindness can change one's life. It blesses both the giver and the recipient. It can throw out roots of love and virtues in all directions. The roots may spring up and new trees may grow. We become human beings only when we help others without expectation. The seeds of kindness can grow into many folds later. Now read on the anecdote.

About the Author



A. J. CRONIN

Archibald Joseph Cronin, MD, DPH, MRCP (1896–1981) was a Scottish novelist and a Physician. His career as a novelist started in 1930 when he was designated with a chronic ulcer and was compelled to take six months complete rest. During this time he was able to indulge in his lifelong desire to write a novel having previously written nothing but prescriptions and scientific papers. His first novel was Hatters castle, and the most popular being the Citadel. Many of his stories have been adapted to Hollywood movies.
