About the Poet:



Neftali Ricardo Reyes Basoalto (1904-1973), better known by his pen name and, later, legal name Pablo Neruda, was a Chilean poet, diplomat and politician. He derived his pen-name from the Czech poet Jan Neruda. He was born on 12 July 1904, in Parral, Chile. He wrote in a variety of styles and his works include poems, historical epics, political manifestos and a prose autobiography. He often wrote in green ink, which was his personal symbol for desire and hope. He won many awards and the notable ones among them are "International Peace Prize; Lenin Peace Prize (1953); Nobel Prize in Literature (1971)"

Pablo Neruda breathed his last on 23 September 1973, in Santiago, Chile.

Metaphor


It directly refers to one thing by mentioning other eg)Heart of gold
