- 2. The word 'squabble' means 'noisy quarrel'. ('Noisy quarrel' is a noun phrase, so the word should be in the noun form. But there is noun or noun equivalent of the word in the passage, squabbling is a present participle in the passage)
- 3. **The boy read books** while sitting on the platform on the banyan tree.
- 4. During the fig season, birds of all kinds would flock into the branches of the banyan tree and squabble with each other all the time making the banyan tree the noisiest place on the road.
- 5. The books that gave the boy a mixed reading experience include 'The Treasure Island', 'Huckleberry Finn', 'The Mowgli Stories', and the novels of Edgar Rice Burroughs and Louisa May Alcott.
