- 26. Make a review of the poem 'Ecology' by A.K. Ramanujan.

Hints: Reverence and affinity – mother nature – poet decides to cut Champak trees – mother does not allow to cut – Eco poetry.

27. How did the thieves carry out their plans to plunder the passengers?

Hints: Entry of three thieves – the first with deep scar – second leapt on the bus – the third clung to the bar.

28. How could the writer succeed in depicting the vivid picture of the people of Azores?

Hints: Group of islands – lazy, poor, shiftless and sleepy-the principal crop is corn
– no development in technology and infrastructure.

29. Comment on the dramatic purpose of the opening scene of the play, 'Pygmalion'.

Hints: Heavy late-night thunder storms – people gather under the portico of St. Paul's church – quarrel with the note taker – Colonel Pickering as gentleman.

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(B) Answer any 2 questions from 30 to 32. Each carries 6 scores. $(2 \times 6 = 12)$

30. 'Night Rain' portrays the loneliness, dejection and despondency of a woman – Elucidate.

Hints: Night rain as a young woman – weeping, laughing and whimpering – consoles the speaker – resemblance of the poet's miseries with the night rain'.

31. Narrate the sportsman spirit runs through the veins of the people of Dilshan and Deewar.

Hints: Dilshan and Deewar neighbouring villages – Kabaddi as their favourite game – Manohar Ram's political interference Lt. Aaron's bet – eats his hot.

32. English can rightly be regarded as the key to a treasure – house of knowledge – Elaborate.

Hints: English as a Global language – window to the world – language of Science and Technology.

Answer any 2 questions from 33 to 35. Each carries 8 scores. $(2 \times 8 = 16)$

33. Make a critical appreciation of the poem 'The Journey of the Magi'.

Hints: Testifies the influence of religion – poet's search for solution to human dilemma – problems faced by the Magi – usage of biblical references – an old white horse- six hands at open door dicing for a pieces of silver – Birth and death – duality.

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34. Through the poem "No More Hiroshimas", the poet revealed to the world the commercialized post-war faces of Japan – Explain.

Hints: An outright plea to realise the consequences of the war – relics of the war – bombed industry promotion hall – Atomic bomb explosion centre – peace tower museum.

35. The evolution of the character Eliza Doolittle from a flower girl to dutchess is an achievement of a common girl who sets her goal to change her future – Justify.

Hints: Entry of Eliza in the Act I – Street flower girl – quarrel with Freddy's family – note takers actions – approaches Higgins to learn standard English – Many hardship had gone through – Garden party – success.

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
