	Convection to delve deeper into the experiences of climate warriors.
	Staying up-to-date with the latest happenings through YouTube videos
	and news articles.
	Sharing what we learn and letting climate change become part of
	regular conversations, whether at the dinner table, at an office gathering or on social media, thereby learning from one another.
	Then, it is time for concrete action. Every big idea or solution stems from an individual driven to make a change at an institutional level. There is no requirement to "switch" to a different profession. It is possible to make a difference within your current profession or career path.
4	Climate change is multi-faceted. It combines economy, physical science, law, social sciences, agriculture, business, education and activism. It has entered every sector; the financial and corporate world through Environment Social Governance, the tourism sector through eco- tourism, the architecture sector through sustainable urban planning, and so on. Each of these is looking for ways to mitigate their contribution to climate change. We must become a part of this movement in our own individual and collective capacities.
5	The opportunities in each field are endless since they branch out further. We may find a niche area that suits us. For a lawyer, there is environmental litigation or policy research. A journalist can focus on sustainable business or wildlife conservation. A scientist can work in the field of meteorology,
