Lesson Plan: STD III

Exploring Shapes Through Greeting Card Design

Objective:

- Students will learn about shapes, including circles, while creating a greeting card for a new student.
- Students will practice spatial awareness and counting skills as they arrange shapes on the card.

STD : III

Materials Needed:

- Blank greeting cards or cardstock
- Markers, crayons, or colored pencils

Lesson Outline:
