Several diseases are spread by polluted water. These include diarrohea, Cholera and typhoid. During the period of Italian Renaissance, the term 'cartoon' meant the first sketch in actual size of a large work of art like wall painting.) When newspapers and magazines began to use drawings to illustrate News and editorial opinioo and to provide amusement, these drawings came to be known as cartoons. In the days before the newspaper, artists like Hogarth, Davmier and Rawlandson made a series of drawings on a single theme. They were the ancestors of present day cartoons and comic strips. In the nineteeth and early twentieth centuries, there were a number of magazines which specialized in cartoons. In paris there was one called 'Charivari' and in London there was the famous 'punch'. Nowadays movies based on cartoon characters are also made.
