Answer Key for the Second Term English Examination - Model Question Paper 3

I. Reading Comprehension (5 Marks)

- 1. Della was crying because she had only \$1.87 to buy Jim a gift for Christmas Day.
- 2. The repeated color "grey" symbolizes **poverty**, **gloom**, or **distress** (reflecting Della's sad emotional state).
- 3. Della considered her hair her "most prized possession" because it was her most valuable asset.
- 4. The phrase "...eyes shining" suggests **sudden hope**, **determination**, or **excitement** after she realized what she could do.
- 5. Noun Phrase: Della. Verb Phrase: searched for the perfect gift.

II. Poem/Drama Appreciation (4 Marks)

- 6. The season described is **autumn** (the nineteenth autumn). The mood is one of **melancholy**, **sadness**, or **reflection**because the poet feels time passing and change occurring.
- 7. It reveals that the swans possess a quality of **eternal youth**, **passion**, or **permanence** because their hearts "have not grown old".
- 8. The figure of speech is **Personification** (Autumn acting upon him) or **Metonymy** (using the number of years for his age/life stage).
- 9. The poet feels a sense of loss because the swans' constancy/permanence contrasts sharply with his own aging/emotional changes and the passage of time in his life.

III. Paragraph Question - Prose (4 Marks)

- 10. The passengers were distressed because they were informed that **the journey would be delayed** as the train had to stop to carry a consignment of **human corpses** from the battlefield.
- 11. The stout man initially appears strong because he tries to maintain an **air of stoicism** and **composure**, but he finally breaks down when he realizes that the corpse consignment includes **the body of his twenty-year-old son**.
- 12. The discussion conveys that **parental love is universal** and **overrides all class differences** or social status; all parents share the same grief over the loss of a child in war.
- 13. C) The emotional cost of war.

Long Answer - (Attempt any ONE from each pair) (21 Marks)

(Note: Answers are assessed on content, coherence, organization, and adherence to discourse features. Marks are typically split between Content/Ideas and Format/Organisation/Language.)

- 14. A. Critical Appreciation of the Song: Focus on the song's structure, the theme of poverty/suffering in the city, **social indifference** (people ignoring the suffering), and the power/impact of the repetitive **refrain** as a structural and emotional device. **OR** B. Review of "The Wild Swans at Coole": Focus on the poem's atmosphere (autumnal, reflective), the **emotional conflict** between the poet's aging spirit and the swans' **permanence/unchanging nature**, and the central theme of **change** vs. **constancy**.
- 15. A. Diary Entry (Grieving Mother from "War"): Must be dated, personal, and emotional. Reflection on the stout man's emotional collapse, the realization of shared grief despite class difference, and deeper anguish over the war's personal cost. OR B. Influence of Nature/Hermitage in Shakuntalam: Describe how the peaceful, unspoiled nature fosters the characters' innocence, beauty, and simplicity (Shakuntala, the fawns). The hermitage is a place of virtue and tranquility which contrasts with the royal court.
- 16. A. Character Sketch of Hauchecome ("A String"): Must highlight his personality (frugal, obsessive about small things), his strong sense of honour (his absolute denial of the theft), and the tragedy of the community's refusal to believe him, leading to his demise. OR B. Write-up on Salim Ali's Contribution ("Trills and Thrills"): Focus on his role as the "Birdman of India," his extensive field research, his popularization of birdwatching as a serious study, and his efforts in conservation through advocacy and founding/supporting organizations.

V. Advertisement Analysis (5 Marks)

- 17. The main purpose of the poster is to **promote/advertise Avian Haven Bird Sanctuary** as a tourist destination.
