## 1. Culture

## • 3(B) Civics (Constitution):

- a) Classification:
  - Secularism: The state has no official religion.
  - Republic: The head of the state is an elected person.
- **b) Short Note:** The Preamble states the objectives of the constitution, reflects the dreams of the freedom struggle, and declares India as a Sovereign, Socialist, Secular, Democratic Republic.

#### 5. Economics
